His presentations provide science-based





Funds Available for Professional Development

THROUGH THE PD REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

ne of the benefits of being an ACTEM individual member, is the ability to access funds through our Professional Development Reimbursement program. In accordance with ACTEM's mission to enhance and influence education in Maine though the use of technology, individual ACTEM members, who have held membership for at least 180 days, are invited to apply for assistance in the form of reimbursement on qualifying technology professional development opportunities.

WHAT PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES QUALIFY?

The training may be in the form of a conference, workshop, a one or more days seminar, university course, online course or combination thereof. ACTEM will reimburse individuals for course and registration fees associated with the professional development activity. Course materials, lab fees, travel, hotel, meals and other similar costs will not be reimbursed. Reimbursement is limited to one approved activity per ACTEM membership year. The intent of the PD reimbursement program is to pay for activities that your district is not able to support. PLEASE NOTE: Any ACTEM sponsored professional development is not eligible for PD reimbursement (ACTEM conferences or ACTEM sponsored workshops).

HOW MUCH FUNDING IS AVAILABLE TO ME?

- Maine Educators with current INDIVIDUAL ACTEM memberships are invited to apply for up to \$400 per year for professional development reimbursement.
- Your membership must be CURRENT when submitting your application.
- New ACTEM members must hold an individual membership for at least 180-days prior to the start of the professional development activity to be eligible for the reimbursement benefit.

HOW DO I APPLY?

- Complete an online application at this link BEFORE your PD activity begins: http://www.actem.org/ Online-PD-Application-Form
- 2. Your application must be received and approved prior to the start date of the professional-development activity.
- 3. You will need to pay for you PD activity upfront with personal funds. ACTEM does not reimburse districts through this program.
- 4. Complete you PD activity.
- 5. Submit proof of completion and personal payment to Dennis Kunces, ACTEM PD Administrator at dennis.kunces@gmail.com
- 6. Reimbursement payments are generally processed within a few days after submitting your completion and payment documents.



5 TIPS FOR MAKING DIGITAL LEARNING ACCESSIBLE TO ALL STUDENTS

n many ways, Rhianon Gutierrez did not have a typical education growing up. Born hard of hearing, she learned early on the difference that the accessibility of educational content can make.

"My grandmother and my mother were very strong advocates for me," Gutierrez said. "They worked to ensure I had access in education. As a result, I'm a strong advocate today."

Today, Gutierrez is a digital learning specialist with Boston Public Schools and the creator of the ISTE micro-course Designing for Inclusion. She's also an award-winning multimedia producer whose experiences with accessible education eventually led her to Universal Design for Learning (UDL), a framework recognizes that all students learn differently and aims to reduce the physical, cognitive, intellectual and organizational barriers to learning that vary with each child. When she became an educator, she realized that she had the ability – and the responsibility – to be an advocate for inclusive learning for all her students, the way her mother and grandmother were for her.

"As educators ... we have the power to curate how, when, where and what other people learn," she explained. "We have the power to choose wisely and make sure we choose accessible media for all."

Gutierrez specializes in producing multimedia content that's accessible to students of all abilities. Every time she evaluates or creates educational content, she focuses on five simple ways to make it more inclusive. Here is how you can make your learning materials accessible.

- Write alt text for your images. Students
 who have visual limitations can use screen
 reader programs to read the content of
 a website out loud. But this only works
 for images if you add alt text describing
 them.
- 2. Caption your videos. Students who are hard of hearing won't understand the audio from videos without captions. Transcriptions also help visual learners retain content better. Several online tools, such as Amara.org, DotSub.com and Subtitle
- Horse, will help you caption videos for free.
- **3. Transcribe your podcasts.** Podcasts are audio only, so, by definition, they won't work for those who can't hear unless you transcribe them into text. There are online tools, such as Scribie, that transcribe podcasts for free.
- **4. Structure your website for ADA compliance.** Public school websites are required by law to follow Americans with Disabili-

ties Act guidelines that affect the design and coding of navigation menus, links, images, color, tables, multimedia embeds and more. Talk to your IT department or look up the guidelines to make sure your content is accessible to everyone.

5. Use the right tools. Gutierrez uses a number of digital tools to create accessible content, ranging from free online tools, such as Skype and Google Classroom, to paid software, such as the literacy support solution Read&Write.



K-12 School Security Guide Suite Now Available to Schools

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) School Safety Task Force has released the K-12 School Security Guide Suite, a set of products designed to inform safety and physical security planning for kindergarten through grade 12 schools across the United States.

Developed in partnership with the RAND Corporation, the K-12 School Security Guide Suite is comprised of the CISA K-12 School Security Guide (3rd Edition) and accompanying School Security Assessment Tool (SSAT). The Guide and SSAT provide a comprehensive doctrine and methodology to assist schools in conducting more robust vulnerability assessments and implementing layered physical security elements across K-12 districts and campuses. Both products are available on CISA.gov and are designed to support school communities in strengthening their protection and mitigation capabilities against the range of targeted violence and crime-related threats they might face.

Specifically, the K-12 School Security Guide Suite includes:

- CISA K-12 School Security Guide, 3rd Ed. The 3rd Edition of the K-12 School Security Guide is designed to help education agencies across the United States adopt a systems-based approach to the planning and implementation of layered physical security in schools. Additionally, the Guide demonstrates how taking a systems-based approach to layered physical security can help schools create safe and secure learning environments without asking staff members to become security experts.
- CISA School Security Assessment Tool (SSAT) The K-12 School Security Assessment Tool (SSAT) was developed to help schools create safe and secure learning environments. The SSAT incorporates school context and applies the systems-based approach described in the 3rd edition of CISA's K-12 School Security Guide, to improve a school's physical security. The SSAT and 3rd Edition of the Guide build on the prior second editions of both documents.
- CISA School Security Assessment Tool (SSAT) User Guide The User Guide is intended to help users of the K-12 School Security Assessment Tool (SSAT) understand the purpose of the tool, how to use the tool, and how to interpret assessment results. It serves as a 101-introduction to the SSAT.
- CISA School Security Assessment Tool (SSAT) Technical Appendix The Technical Appendix is intended to provide users of the K-12 School Security Assessment Tool (SSAT) with a detailed understanding of the creation, operation, and functionality of the SSAT.

The release of the K-12 School Security Guide Suite marks an important milestone in CISA's continued efforts to advance safe, secure, and resilient schools, and to keep our Nation's students safe. 

he Maine Community College System (MCCS), through the Harold Alfond Center for Workforce Advancement, is offering supplemental funding for training that upgrades frontline incumbent workers' skills, leading to career advancement and job security. Rethinking and reshaping social studies instruction in Maine

On February 26, 2021, we convened a group of social studies supervisors across the state to discuss how we can include greater cultural responsiveness, civic engagement, and inquiry in instruction. Here are a few interesting insights shared during the virtual roundtable discussion.



1

Reexamine and refresh existing materials to address problematic perspectives and lack of representation

During the session, attendees reported that some of their top challenges were feeling stuck with existing materials that can be tainted with bias and racism. One leader put it beautifully – "We must load up our classroom libraries with books that children can see themselves in," and another mentioned the importance of building background knowledge on complex topics so students get a holistic picture of issues.

2

Ground civic engagement in shared purpose and the issues students care about

One leader shared that every year, their school rallies behind a service learning focus that shapes volunteer activities throughout the year and gets the entire school community invested in a common purpose. Another social studies supervisor has had success with student-led civic learning projects so that students can dive into issues that are most meaningful to them.

3

Put students in the driver's seat to activate natural curiosity and inquiry

Let students lead their curiosity by searching for and finding articles on their own. Students will be more engaged in the inquiry process when they have the freedom to choose topics most interesting to them. One leader noted that sometimes, this means giving teachers permission to not talk too much, and letting students fill the time with discovery and peer-topeer discussion.

CS Discoveries (Grade 6-10)

An introductory computer science course that empowers students to create and use computer science as a medium for creativity, communication, problem solving, and fun. The curriculum length is **50-150** hours and can be taught as a semester or full-year course.



CS Principles (Grade 9-12)

A more advanced introductory course that teaches the basics of computer science and challenges students to think about how computing and technology can change the world. It can be taught as an AP or non-AP course.

Curriculum length: 100-180 hours, should be taught as a full-year course. It contains 10 units, including a Create Performance

Task prep unit.



CSA (Grade 9-12)

Computer Science A introduces students to Java programming and may be taken after completing Computer Science Principles or Computer Science Discoveries and/or a similar introductory computer science course. Educate Maine Releases 9th Annual Education Indicators for Maine Report

Educate Maine has released the 2021 edition of our annual Education Indicators for Maine report. This annual report measures access, participation, and attainment through the educational pipeline in Maine from early childhood through postsecondary education. This year the report includes a variety of additional indicators reflecting student well-being, access to technology, and adult education. The impact of the pandemic has started to be reflected in the data. You can now view the report in an interactive online format at educationindicators.me.

KEY TAKEAWAYS

It is important to note that the 2021 report contains information from the 2019, 2020, and 2021 school years depending on what data was available for each indicator. This web report format allows us to update the indicators as soon as new data becomes available.

- Maine has made progress throughout the educational pipeline: in particular, the number of CTE students has increased beyond 9,000 students for the first time, and the number of Mainers holding postsecondary degrees or credentials of value has continued to increase (53%).
- The pandemic caused declines in post-secondary enrollment (55%) and completion (63%).
- Slightly more than half of middle and high school students report feeling like they matter in their community.
- The availability and affordability of early childhood education continues to be essential for parents to participate in the workforce. 71% of Maine children under 6 years old have all available parents in the workforce.
- Achievement gaps are significant within post-secondary education based on race/ethnicity, economic status, and gender.
